Overview

A workshop was organised for B.Ed students of Hansraj Jivandas College of Education, Mumbai to introduce them to Free and Open-source Software (FOSS), and the use of '**Spoken Tutorials**' to help them learn and master various FOSS. The salient features of self-learning through an audio-video tool in an interactive manner were demonstrated to them. An introductory training session of around 2 hrs was conducted on 'Libreoffice Writer', which is one of the LibreOffice components, that helps in developing basic computer usage skills such as word processing, documentation and much more. 39 students attended the workshop, headed by their faculty member, Prof Shrima Banerjee. In the session, most of the students could complete the basic level tutorials and some could also go through the next level ones.
